CITY OF ALLISON COUNCIL MEETING MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 29TH, 2025

Special Meeting:

Mayor Henrichs opened the special meeting of the City of Allison City Council at 5:15 p.m. The Council members present were Bangasser, Galey, Henning, Heuer. Absent: Stirling. Also, present were Deb McWhirter, Janis Cramer, Lisa Cassman, and Sara Henrichs. Henning made a motion to approve the agenda with a second by Heuer. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Open Forum:

Sara Henrichs talked with the council about extending their timeline to get all the logs moved from the City Property. The Council previously decided that on October 1st, the logs needed to be moved but gave an extension through the weekend, making the new date the 5th.

Council member Galey asked what was going to be done with logs that are on Cooper's lot at the

end of main street. Sara let them know that they will be cutting them up through the winter and should be gone by Spring as they use them for their wood burner.

Lisa Cassman let the council know that the light that is under the Allison sign must have been bumped as it is now shining into cars windshields at night. Mayor Henrichs said that he would go over and adjust the light back.

Council Member Bangasser let the council know that her and Council member Galey went in and talked with Chris about what they are looking for with the new Neptune system to help catch errors that are stemming from the system. Deputy Clerk, Chris Graser will be working with Neptune and GWORKS to resolve these issues and will also be working with council members Bangasser and Galey for a smoother billing transition.

Consent Agenda:

No Action was taken during this time.

New Business:

The council reviewed a quote re-

ceived from DCL Trading Co. in the amount of \$2,600.00 for 2 new handheld radios for the ambulance. They need new radios as the old ones are no longer working with the new antenna that was but up by the county.

Motion by Henning to approve the ambulance purchasing two new handheld radios in the amount of \$2,600.00 from DCL Trading Co. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Old Business:

The council held a discussion regarding the City getting a code enforcer for nuisance properties. It was decided that to move forward with this, a job description is going to be created for a contract position. This topic will be further discussed at the council meeting on Monday October 13th, 2025, at 5:15 p.m.

Sara Henrichs came and discussed debt service with the Council. Initially when the Henrichs put up their shop they were told that they would not be charged a second debt service if they chose to

put a meter in their shop. Had they known they would have had to pay a second debt service they would have hooked the water up to their house from the shop. It was asked that the council consider looking at debt service on a per parcel basis as this is how property taxes are figured. The Council asked City Administrator/City Clerk, Alexis Wiegmann, to see if she could find the original ordinance when debt service was put into place to see how it was originally worded. This topic will be further discussed at the next council meeting on October 13th, 2025, at 5:15 p.m.

CITY OF CLARKSVILLE CITY COUNCIL BUSINESS MEETING October 6

The Clarksville City Council met in regular session on October 6, 2025 in the City Council Chambers at 6:30 p.m. with Mayor Jerald Heuer presiding and Council Members: Roger Doty, Taran Sherburne, Ruth Saulsbury (by phone), and Jennifer Kielman. Absent: Jessi Reints. Other City employees present were: Molly Bohlen, City Clerk, Jared Brunner, Maintenance, Hunter Fasse, Maintenance Asst., Chief Mackey and Reserve Officer Brown. Members of the public: Chris White and John Riherd.

Chris White is present and complained of campers being parked around his area of town, as well as nuisance properties. He is wondering what can be done in this area as there seems to be a lot going on at all hours of the day/night. Heuer states that they can talk with the Police Department about the area in question.

Motion Sherburne, Doty to approve agenda as listed for October 6, 2025. Ayes: Sherburne, Saulsbury, Doty, Kielman. Nays: None. Absent: Reints.

Motion Kielman, Sherburne to approve consent agenda including September Financial Reports & Claims, Minutes (09-22-2025), Liquor licenses for Honky Tonk and Clarksville Star as official newspaper for 2026. Explanation of items provided by Clerk per Examin-

ers recommendation. Ayes: Sherburne, Saulsbury, Doty, Kielman. Nays: None. Absent: Reints.

Yield Sign Follow up: Clerk provided Ordinance regarding yield signs. Discussion with Council and Maintenance. Maintenance states that they do not have any extra yield signs, but would have to order. Questions arise regarding which intersections should be a trial run for this. Saulsbury wonders if the sign committee needs to come back together and look at intersections. Heuer felt this would be beneficial. Mackey states that if you look at data from accidents that have occurred in town there are already signs in the areas to take care of.

Butler County Engineer Shed Discussion. Riherd is present to discuss the project and answer questions. He states that he had stopped last month as the county is wanting to build a few new sheds for a county wide upgrade. There would be 3 sheds being built-1 in Kesley, 1 in Bristow area, and 1 in Clarksville. These would be centralized locations in order to store their equipment, supplies and some repair equipment. He does realize that if this is something that Council would be interested in looking at there would have to be Public Hearings and the values of the land would need to be looked at, but before he got too far into the research he did want the Council's opinion. Kielman questions the timeline of this happening. Riherd states that they would like to start with the

building by spring of 2026.

Tree Planting on Buy outs-Clerk provided update from INRCOG. Basically there appears to be one of the buyout properties that would be appropriate to complete this, however we do need to reach out to Homeland Security to gain permission for the project. INRCOG has requested that that Iowa Homeland Security reach out to us to answer the questions appropriately to know the direction we can head.

Building Permits:

1. Allan Kluitert: 120 W. Weare St.; adding 4 season room to west side of house. Heuer states that he was able to speak with the builder and reports that the current building permit to add to the south side of house would not be possible because of setback requirements, however due to the timing of the meeting another building permit was not able to be turned in. City Builders did talk with Heuer and states that they would build onto the west side of the house 14x16x14 foot addition that would meet the requirements. Motion Kielman, Sherburne to approve building permit as presented by Mayor and Maintenance. Ayes: Sherburne, Saulsbury, Doty, Kielman. Nays: None. Absent: Reints.

Pre-registered voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered – such as voters registering to vote on election day – and voters changing precincts must

also provide proof of residence. A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) 1) may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct. 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the county auditor's office by 12 p.m. (Noon) Monday, November 10th. Election Day Registrant at-festers must provide an approved form of identification.
