CITY OF CLARKSVILLE CITY COUNCIL BUSINESS MEETING

October 7, 2024

The Clarksville City Council met in regular session on October 7, 2024 in the City Council Chambers at 6:30 p.m. with Mayor Jerald Heuer presiding and Council Members Roger Doty, Ruth Saulsbury, Jessi Reints Jennifer Kielman, and Taran Sherburne (by phone). Other City employees present were: Molly Bohlen, City Clerk, Jared Brunner, Maintenance, Police Chief Mackey and Reserve Officer Brown. Members of the public present: Rae Hovenga, Megan Wedeking, Justin Wedeking, Kayla Vance, Tim Jordan, Jill Grover, John Wehling, Kari Coates, Rhonda Landrum, Crystal Eckhoff, Laura Wallin, Laura Bohr, Jessica Stout, Paul Miller, Josh Hovenga.

No Public Comments.
Heuer asked if Council would move item #4 New Business to the top of the Agenda. Motion Kielman, Reints to approve moving Kari Coates item on EMS levy to top of the agenda. Ayes: Saulsbury, Doty, Reints, Sherburne, Kielman. Nays: None. Absent: None.

Kari Coates, Butler County EMS Coordinator came to talk about the EMS levy, the importance of it and the rate of burn out in the volunteer emergency services. She shared what her role consists of and how it has assisted rural communities in Butler County in order to respond to emergencies. Coates is asking for \$150,000 total which would result in a 14 cent per thousand increase on taxes. If your house is assessed at \$100,000 taxable value is \$46,342.80 so the increase would be \$6.49 and on 100 acres of Agland valued at \$179,000 making the taxable valuation at \$128,588.23 with the tax increase would be \$18.01 per year. Ballot language is going to state up to a certain amount but they may

not need the entire asking, but this would allow for adjustments at a later date without going back on the ballot. Any extra will stay in the EMS account and not to the county general fund. Coates discussed what she envisions the future looking like including hiring another person to help with coverage and an additional vehicle. Coates states that she is just wanting residents to make an informed decision and welcomes any questions regarding this issue. Coates states that since July she has been a 1st responder to scenes 160 times.

Mayor Topics:

1. Update on Flood Mitigation: Heuer states that we are in the process of getting the flood gates and that we have received the approval to extend the dike to the north from the Conservation Board. He has spoke with Chris Showalter about the CUT program which has to do with DNR, FEMA, Iowa Corp of Engineers to look at areas that could be improved upon. At some point during the process Heuer would like to get a Committee formed for this issue.

Motion Sherburne, Doty to approve Consent Agenda including: September Claims & Financial Reports, Minutes from 9/16/2024, and Top of Iowa Lucky Wife Liquor License. Ayes: Saulsbury, Doty, Reints, Sherburne, Kielman. Nays: None. Absent: None.

Heuer addressed the public regarding the Rules & Regulations at the City Park/Ball Diamonds and invited them to address the council if they wanted.

Kayla Vance is a volunteer for K-2 City Rec Program. She had some questions including: what would the funds be used towards, will the fees be assessed to the Clarksville Tribe program, how will this be enforced as well as concerns that the fee would discourage some kids from participating. Vance speaks of the great opportunity provided by vol-

unteers to athletes of the Clarksville community. Vance states that her sons also play travel ball and knows the cost assessed for that which she would happily share if needed.

Jill Lodge questioned how this has been enforced in the past. She feels that this program is trying to grow teams in Clarksville but also states that her son does play travel ball out of town as well.

Justin Wedeking, along with wife Megan run the Clarksville Tribe programs. He would like to know the definition of a travel team Heuer spoke up and said that any team that is not City Rec or represented by the school. Wedeking gave the history of the Tribe program which when first started had all Clarksville girls, but over time and due to numbers they have had to open it up to other towns. He states that they did hold tryouts, they do not charge for their time and no facility charges. Wedeking gave the cost per girl per team which included cost of attending tournaments. He states that they did charge \$20 this year for equipment but that was for the purchase of softballs for tournaments.

Tim Jordan states that there are different age groups for various reasons including skill set and safety reasons of whether the girls are ready to move up.

Wallin states that the City does the Maintenance and big purchase items such as the new fencing, etc.

Kielman states that the reason this was looked into was because the city was approached by a team from out of town wanting to rent the fields. We found a resolution from 1996 stating the \$25 fee with \$25 deposit for the rental of the ball diamonds. So the thought was to keep the amount the same but also do a yearly fee to provide continuous use. however others need to be help accountable and responsible. She states that there has been a lot of information shared that wasn't

available before.

Clerk presented 2023-2024 Street Finance Report.

Motion Kielman, Saulsbury to approve Resolution 24-20 Street Finance Report. Ayes: Saulsbury, Doty, Reints, Sherburne, Kielman. Nays: None. Absent: None.

Heuer presents an extension to the Street Project after meeting with Ted Hoodjer. He explained to the council the area is question.

Justin Wedeking, Reints to approve additional extension to the corner of N. Elizabeth and W. Prospect for road project. Ayes: Saulsbury, Doty, Reints, Sherburne, Kielman. Nays: None. Absent: None.

Building Permits presented by Maintenance.

1. Myrna Beechey to replace sidewalk in front of the house.

Motion Reints, Sherburne to approve building permit as presented by Maintenance. Ayes: Saulsbury, Doty, Reints, Sherburne, Kielman. Nays: None. Absent: None.

Richard McBurney, Secretary/Treasurer @ CARD was present to give history of CARD and the improvements that they are looking at making. He discussed the need for a new irrigation system, aeration system and well system. In order to open up Grant process for more opportunities they would like to have city be the fiscal partner for that. McBurney states that there are a few events throughout the year that CARD helps with including Pioneer Days tournament and the high school golf team utilize the course. Saulsbury questions whether the cross country team could use the course for meets.

Motion Doty, Sherburne to adjourn regular City Council meeting at 8:03 pm.

MINUTES AND PROCEEDINGS OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BUTLER COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HELD ON OCTOBER 1, 2024.

Meeting called to order at 9:01 A.M. by Chairman Wayne Dralle with members Rusty Eddy and Greg Barnett present. Moved by Barnett second by Eddy to approve the agenda. All ayes. Motion carried.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read. Motioned by Eddy, second by Barnett to approve the minutes as read. All ayes. Motion carried.

Barnett commented during Public Comment that he has received some calls about inability to see while turning on 220th and Vail, near the ethanol plant. John Riherd, Engineer, stated that he is aware of this and will look into it more.

Board discussed Summit Carbon Solutions, LLC surveying Rolling

Prairie Bike Trail. Matt Morris, Conservation Director, stated that he was contacted by Summit about surveying around the bike trail east and north east of Clarksville. David Kuehner, County Attorney, mentioned potentially making them get a court order to survey the land. The supervisors agreed that they should not voluntarily allow them to survey and let them seek a court order.

Matt Morris, updated the Board on the Shell Rock Watershed Coalition. The purpose of the Shell Rock River Watershed Management Plan is to serve and assess measures concerning floods, water quality, and recreation. The plan has been finalized and this update is the first step in the plan. They are seeking to add the cities of Clarksville, Allison, and Greene to the Coalition. Morris relayed the goals of the coalition as they initiate the plan.

Board considered utility permit for

Cedar Falls Utilities new pole and underground service near 32261 310th St. Motioned by Barnett, second by Eddy to approve the utility permit. All ayes. Motion carried.

An Engineer's update was provided. Riherd commented in relation to the Shell Rock Watershed Coalition that there are new water retention structures being utilized to help with flood water around crossings. A letter has been received from Iowa Northern detailing their commitment to close and re-route the crossings near Shell Rock. A couple bridges in the northwest part of the county have been opened. There will be work in Kesley and some other culverts throughout the county.

Motioned by Barnett, second by Eddy to approve claims. All ayes. Motion carried.

Any voter who requires assistance to vote by reason of blindness, disability, or inability to read or write may be given assistance at the polls by a person of the voter's choice, other than the voter's employer or agent of that employer, or officer or agent of the voter's union. Any voter who is physically unable to enter a polling place has the right to vote in the voter's vehicle.

Voter ID: All voters will be asked to show their ID before voting at the polls, including voters who are already registered in the correct precinct, voters who move within the county to a new precinct, and voters who are not yet registered to vote in the county. Visit https://voterreadyiowa.org/resources for information regarding valid voter identification and proof of residency.

Absentee Voting

Absentee ballots are available in the Auditor's Office, where Butler County voters may vote absentee in person through 5:00 p.m. on Monday, November 4th. Iowa ID required.

To vote by mail, the Auditor's Office must receive a written request for a ballot using one of the following methods:

- An official form can be found at https://butlercounty.iowa.gov/
- On paper no smaller than 3" x 5"
- Voters may also submit a request for an absentee ballot by email or fax if it contains an original signature. Original such requests must also be mailed to the Auditor with a postmark date no later than the pre-registration deadline for the election for which the ballot was requested (October 21st, 2024 for the General Election).
- All requests must include the voter's name, birthdate, residence address,

mailing address if different, name or date of election, along with the following new required information: Iowa Driver's License number or Nonoperator Iowa ID number, or if you do not have an Iowa ID then you must use the IVoter issued PIN number. Please call the Auditor's Office at 319-346-6547 for help in finding your Voter PIN number if you do not have or cannot find your Iowa ID.

Deadlines for this election:

Last day to pre-register and or request that an absentee ballot be mailed is 5:00 p.m. Monday, October 21.

Last day to vote an Absentee Ballot in person is 5:00 p.m. Monday, November 4th.

A voted absentee ballot must be received by 8:00 p.m. Election Day (November 5, 2024) to be considered on time to be counted. *Except UOCAVA and Safe at Home

A voter's absentee ballot may NOT be turned in to the polling place for counting, however the voter or the voter's designee may turn the ballot in to the Auditor by the time of close on Election Day. (8:00 p.m.)

Constitutional Amendment

Shall the following amendment to the Constitution be adopted?

Summary: Provides that the lieutenant governor will act as the governor if there is a temporary disability of the governor. Further provides that the lieutenant governor or lieutenant governor-elect will be the governor or governor-elect in the case of the resignation, death, or permanent disability of the governor or governor-elect thus creating a vacancy in the office of lieutenant governor or lieutenant governor-elect, as appropriate.

Full Text: Section 17 of Article IV of the Constitution of the State of Iowa is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:
Sec. 17. Lieutenant governor or lieutenant governor-elect to become or act as governor or governor-elect. If there is a temporary disability of the governor, the lieutenant governor shall act as governor until the disability is removed, or the governor dies, resigns, or is removed from office. In case of the death, resignation, or removal from office of the governor, the lieutenant governor shall become governor for the remainder of the term, which shall create a vacancy in the office of lieutenant governor. This section shall also apply, as appropriate, to the governor-elect and the lieutenant governor-elect.

Constitutional Amendment

Summary: Provides for only U.S. citizens aged 18 or older and meeting state and county residency requirements to vote in all elections. Further provides that 17-year-olds who will be 18 years old by the General Election are eligible to vote in the primary election, subject to the same citizenship and residency requirements.

Full Text: Section 1 of Article II of the Constitution of the State of Iowa, as amended by the amendment of 1970, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:
Section 1. Electors. Only a citizen of the United States of the age of eighteen years, who shall have been a resident of this state for such period of time as shall be provided by law and of the county in which the citizen claims the citizen's vote for such period of time as shall be provided by law, shall be entitled to vote at all elections which are authorized by law. However, for purposes of a primary election, a United States citizen must be at least eighteen years of age as of the next general election following the primary election. The required periods of residence shall not exceed six months in this state and sixty days in the county.
