Moved by Barnett, seconded by Kampman, to approve the agenda. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Kampman, seconded by Maiers, to approve minutes for the December 18, 2024 board meeting. Carried unanimously

Instructional Support Program Resolution of Participation

Director Tim Backer introduced and caused to be read the Resolution hereinafter set out and moved its adoption; seconded by Director Brandon Kampman; after due consideration thereof by the Board, the President put the question upon the adaptation of said Resolution and. the roll being called, the following Directors voted: AYES: Phil Barnett, Tim Backer, Brandon Kampman, Shelley Maiers, Justin Clark:

NAYES: None Whereupon the President declared said Resolution duly adopted as follows: RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors wishes to extend its participation in the instructional support program as provided in Iowa Code Sections 257.18 through 257.27;

WHEREAS, following a public hearing, the Board deems it necessary and desirable to provide additional funding for the Clarksville Community School District pursuant to the Instructional Support

Program: and WHEREAS, pursuant to a duly published notice, the Board held a public hearing on the guestion of participation in the Instructional

Support Levy Program; and WHEREAS, the Board wishes to take action to adopt a Resolution to Participate in the Instructional Support Program; NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board:

SECTION 1: That the Board adopts the following Instructional Support Program:

The Board of Directors wishes to consider extending its participation in the instructional support program as provided in Iowa Code Sections 257.18 through 257.27, for a period of five (5) years, commencing with the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026.

The additional funding for the instructional support program for a budget year shall be determined annually (after taking into consideration instructional support state aid), and shall not exceed 10% of the total regular program district cost for the budget year and moneys received under Iowa Code section 257.14 as a budget adjustment for the budget year.

Moneys received by the district for the instructional support program may be used to meet the standards for accreditation of Iowa school districts: to purchase textbooks. instructional materials, equipment or supplies including technology equipment/hardware and software; to repair or maintain facilities or equipment; or for any other general fund purpose, all subject to the limitations of Iowa Code Section 257.19.

The instructional support program shall be funded by instructional support state aid and a combination of instructional support property tax levied annually upon the taxable property within the school district commencing with the levy of property taxes for collection in the fiscal year ending June 30. 2026, and an instructional support income surtax imposed annually, the percent of income surtax (not to exceed twenty percent (20%)) to be determined by the Board for each budget year to be imposed upon the state individual income tax of each individual income taxpayer resident in the school district on December 31, 2025, and each year thereafter.

Unless, within twenty-eight days following the adoption of this resolution, the secretary of the board receives a petition containing the signatures of eligible electors equal in number to not less than one hundred or thirty percent of the number of voters at the last preceding regular school election, whichever is greater, asking that an election be called to approve or disapprove this action of the board adopting the instructional support program. this action of the board is final and the secretary is authorized and directed to certify a copy of this resolution to the Department of Management.

In the event a petition containing the required number of signatures is filed with the secretary of the board within twenty-eight days of the adoption of this resolution, the president shall call a meeting of the board to consider rescission of this resolution or to direct the county commissioner of elections to submit the following question to the qualified electors of the school district at a special election. If the Board determines to sub-

mit the question to the electors, the proposition to be submitted shall be as follows: Shall the board of directors of the

Clarksville Community School District in the County of Butler, State of lowa, be authorized for a period of ten years to levy and impose an instructional support tax in an amount (after taking into consideration instructional support state aid) of not exceeding 10% of the total regular program district cost for the budget year and moneys received under Iowa Code Section 257.14 as a budget adjustment in the budget year, and be authorized annually, in combination, as determined by the board to levy a combination of an instructional support property tax upon all the taxable property within the school district commencing with the levy of property taxes for collection in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, and to impose an instructional support income surtax upon the state individual income tax of each individual income taxpaver resident in the school district of December 31 for each calendar year commencing with the calendar year 2025, and each year thereafter, the percent of

income surtax not to exceed twenty percent (20%) to be determined by the board for each fiscal year. to meet the standards for accreditation of Iowa school districts; to purchase textbooks, instructional materials, equipment or supplies including technology equipment/ hardware and software; to repair or maintain facilities or equipment; or for any other general fund purpose, all subject to the limitations of lowar Code Section 257.19.

SECTION 2: That all resolutions or orders or parts thereof in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
