MINUTES AND PROCEEDINGS OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BUTLER COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HELD ON

AUGUST 6, 2024. Meeting called to order at 9:01 A.M. by Chairman Wayne Dralle with members Rusty Eddy and Greg Barnett present. Moved by Barnett second by Dralle to approve the agenda. All ayes. Motion carried.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read. Motioned by Barnett, second by Dralle to approve the minutes as read. All ayes. Motion carried.

No public comment was received. Board discussed Chapter 422D eligible expenses. Leslie Groen, Auditor, discussed the opinion of Ahlers & Cooney on expenses covered under 422D. It was stated that salaries and benefits were not explicitly outlined under 422D and therefore they would not be included in eligi-

ble expenses. Dralle introduced Resolution 2009-2024 - Resolution Directing County Commissioner Of Elections To Call An Election Submitting The Question Of Adopting A Levy And Imposing A Voter-Approved Emergency Medical Services Property Tax And Local Option Income Surtax Pursuant To Iowa Code Chapter 422D. After reviewing the resolution, motioned by Barnett, second by Eddy to approve Resolution 2009-2024. Roll call was taken: Ayes – Eddy, Dralle, Barnett. Nays – None. Absent-None and Resolution 2009-2024 was adopted as follows: RESOLUTION #2009-2024

RESOLUTION DIRECTING COUNTY COMMISSIONER OF ELECTIONS TO CALL AN ELEC-TION SUBMITTING THE QUES-TION OF ADOPTING A LEVY AND IMPOSING A VOTER-APPROVED EMERGENCY MEDICAL SER-VICES PROPERTY TAX AND LOCAL OPTION INCOME SUR-TAX PURSUANT TO IOWA CODE CHAPTER 422D

WHEREAS, the Butler County Board of Supervisors (the "Board") has previously declared Emergency Medical Services ("EMS") to be an essential service in and for Butler County, Iowa (the "County") in compliance with Iowa Code Section 422D.1(2)(a), recognizing EMS is an essential service to Butler County residents; and

WHEREAS, the Board coordinated efforts with local emergency medical services agencies to establish a county emergency medical services system advisory council (the "Advisory Council") to assist in researching and assessing the service needs of the County and guiding implementation of services in the County within a council structure; and

WHEREAS, the Board is in receipt of a recommendation from the Advisory Council, which recommends funding at an amount of \$150,000 annually, or fourteen cents (\$0.14) per one thousand dollars (\$1000) annually not to exceed seventy-five cents (\$0.75) per one thousand dollars (\$1000) of assessed value on all taxable property within the county and a local option income surtax of not to exceed one percent (1.0%) on the state individual income tax of each individual residing in the county at the end of the individual's applicable tax year; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that to provide EMS in the County, a local property tax and local option income surtax pursuant to Iowa Code 422D for a maximum period of fifteen (15) years is necessary and in the best interests of the County and its residents; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby determines that an election should be called on the question of adopting a

levy and imposing a voter-approved EMS property tax and local option income surtax as authorized by lowa Code Chapter 422D. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RE-

SOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SU-PERVISORS OF BUTLER COUN-TY, STATE OF IOWA: 1. The Board hereby determines

that it is consistent with the recommendation provided by the Advisory Council to provide EMS in the County and it is in the best interest of the County and its residents to provide funding therefor for a period of fifteen (15) years, as provided in Iowa Code Chapter 422D.

2. The funding to support EMS shall be in the amount of \$150,000 annually, or fourteen cents (\$0.14) per one thousand dollars (\$1000) annually not to exceed seventy-five cents (\$0.75) per one thousand dollars (\$1000) of assessed value on all taxable property within the county and a local option income surtax of not to exceed one percent (1.0%) on the state individual income tax of each individual residing in the county at the end of the individual's applicable tax year, and the Board shall determine the annual property tax rate together with the not to exceed one percent local option income surtax necessary to obtain this amount. 3. Moneys received by the County from this property tax may be used for any EMS purpose identified in Iowa Code Chapter 422D and otherwise identified in the plan provided to the Board by the Advisory Council.

4. A special election is called of the qualified electors of Butler County, State of Iowa, on Tuesday, November 5, 2024. The following Proposition is approved, and the Board shall file the Proposition for the Ballot with the Butler County Commissioner of Elections by September 6, 2024 SHALL THE FOLLOWING PUBLIC

MEASURE BE ADOPTED? PROPOSITION

Shall the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, State of Iowa, be authorized to levy and impose a tax for the purpose of funding Emergency Medical Services in the county pursuant to Iowa Code Chapter 422D, in the amount of \$150,000 annually, or fourteen cents (\$0.14) per one thousand dollars (\$1000) annually not to exceed seventy-five cents (\$0.75) per one thousand dollars (\$1000) of assessed value on all taxable property within the county and a local option income surtax of not to exceed one percent (1.0%) on the state individual income tax of each individual residing in the county at the end of the individual's applicable tax year, for a maximum period of fifteen (15) years? 5. That the notice of the election and ballot form used at the election shall be prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Iowa Code and Iowa Administrative Rules.

6. That the Election Board for the voting precinct or precincts shall be appointed by the County Commissioner of Elections, not less than 15 days before the date of said election, a certified copy of which ap-pointment must be officially placed

on file in the office of the Auditor. 7. The County Commissioner of Elections shall make publication of the Notice of Election in a legal newspaper in the county once at least sixty (60) days prior to the date of the election, as required by Iowa

Code Section 422D.1. 8. The "Greene Recorder", "Butler County Tribune and Clarksville Star" and "Parkersburg Eclipse News-Review". legal newspapers published regularly and having a general circulation within the County, are designated to make the publication of the Notice of Election.

9. That the County Commissioner of Elections prepare all ballots and election registers and other supplies necessary for the proper and legal conduct of this election.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC INFORMATIONAL MEETING

Summit Carbon Solutions, LLC ("Summit Carbon Solutions") with a principal place of business of 2321 North Loop Drive, Suite 221, Ames, IA 50010, is developing a carbon capture, storage, and sequestration project, the Midwest Carbon Express ("MCE"), that will enable ethanol plants and other industries in Iowa and four other Midwestern states to reduce their carbon intensity by capturing carbon dioxide ("CO2") from their industrial processes and transporting it through a pipeline system to North Dakota, where it will be permanently and safely stored underground in deep geologic storage locations. This is to notify you that as part of this project, SCS Carbon Transport, LLC ("SCS Carbon Transport"), a subsidiary of Summit Carbon Solutions with a principal place of business of 2321 North Loop Drive, Suite 221, Ames, IA 50010, proposes to build a pipeline connecting one or more ethanol facilities in your (or an adjacent) county to the MCE to capture and store CO2 emissions from such facility. Our goal is to avoid any use of eminent domain, but in some instances, we may need to request approval from the Iowa Utilities Commission to obtain easements for the construction and operation of the pipeline by eminent domain (condemnation). The Iowa Utilities Commission, in considering a petition requesting the right of eminent domain, does so in an open and public process. The lowa Utilities Commission will schedule a public hearing to consider the petition, including the route, any filed objections, the request for eminent domain authority, and to hear testimony to aid it in determining whether to grant the permit and the right

of eminent domain. If the Iowa Utili-


ties Commission grants the right to acquire property rights by eminent domain and voluntary easements are not obtained, it is possible that SCS Carbon Transport may acquire easements by condemnation.

Included with this notice is a map showing the proposed route and the notification corridor in which potentially affected properties in Butler County are located. The final alignment of the pipeline within the identified corridor will be selected after survey and negotiations with landowners are complete.
