ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CLARKSVILLE, IOWA, BY **AMENDING CHAPTER 155,** RESTRICTED RESIDENCE DISTRICT.

A SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. 318:

This Ordinance amends the City Code of the City of Clarksville by replacing Chapter 155, Restricted Residence District, of the City Code with an amended Chapter 155. The new amended Chapter 155 largely adopts the previous language of Chapter 155, and adds new provisions and amendments to

existing provisions, including: The Administrator under the chapter is defined:

Recreational vehicles are defined, and allowed to be used temporarily in certain emergencies;

The number of principal residences or structures on a lot are limit-

Home Occupation and Home Industry permits and regulations are

established;

Chapter; and

dence District; and

Previously constructed accessory buildings are prohibited from being moved in to the city without a permit:

Number of accessory buildings on a lot is limited; Fabric, vinyl or tarp accessory

buildings are prohibited; Language is added regarding the City's remedies for violations of the

The entire city is determined to be in the Restricted Residence District, a zoning map that provides for the entire city to be within the Restricted Residence District is adopted, and a special permit process is established that allows other uses in the Restricted Resi-

Other editorial and format corrections and changes that are not substantial changes to the Code.

Nonconforming uses that were ex-

isting at the time of the adoption of this ordinance and previously allowed by special permit or grandfathered-in under the prior version of Chapter 155 continue to be allowed or grandfathered in.

The effective date of the Ordinance is the date of publication of this summary.
