Barnett commented that in the past they have always tried to follow the approximate 3 00% increase recommended and reminded everyone the board has already approved not to increase in employees' insurance premiums in 2021, even though the county premiums have increased by \$61000. Moved by Barnett to approve a 1.5% increase for elected officials and non-elected, non-deputy employees with no salary increase to supervisors; motioned died for lack of a second. Moved by Eddy to have no salary increases for 2021: motion died for lack of a second. John Zimmerman asked telephonically if supervisors decided this in April during budget time as this is early in the year for taxpayers to know what the total increase would total. Barnett provided Zimmerman with that total of \$60196, which does not include Public Health, Conservation, or Secondary Roads employees. Barnett suggested county departments to budget using the 3.00% increase as the decision will need to be tabled. Heidenwirth said he felt if they had been slowly increasing the tax levy over the years we would not have had such an issue last year. Heidenwirth mentioned we had not raised the levy for over ten years and then last year realized is had to be raised a lot. Heidenwirth also shared concern with deciding salaries before budgeting is completed to make a good decision. Heidenwirth continued that maybe the county should be treated like a business in the fact making salary decisions prior to budgeting is always a hard thing. Barnett suggests everyone complete their normal budgeting using the 3.00% recommendations to get all the numbers together and see the complete picture to make a decision. Discussion was held on when decisions would need to be made which was determined to be prior to the adopted budget due date of March 15, 2021. Eddy commented that he is open to discussion with department heads and hopes they can appreciate the past tough year and today's decision are a start to his plan. Eddy continues that he may not be popular with county employees but his obligation is to the people he represents and his goal is not to have property taxes increase this year or even decrease. John Zimmerman asked telephonically if supervisors decided this in April during budget time as this is early in the year for taxpayers to know what the total increase would total. Barnett provided Zimmerman with that total of \$60196, which does not include Public Health, Conservation, or Secondary Roads employees. Barnett suggested county departments to budget using the 3.00% increase as the decision will need to be tabled. Heidenwirth said he felt if they had been slowly increasing the tax levy over the years we would not have had such an issue last year. Heidenwirth mentioned we had not raised the levy for over ten years and then last year realized is had to be raised a lot. Heidenwirth also shared concern with deciding salaries before budgeting is completed to make a good decision. Heidenwirth continued that maybe the county should be treated like a business in the fact making salary decisions prior to budgeting is always a hard thing. Barnett suggests everyone complete their normal budgeting using the 3.00% recommendations to get all the numbers together and see the complete picture to make a decision. Discussion was held on when decisions would need to be made which was determined to be prior to the adopted budget due date of March 15, 2021. Eddy commented that he is open to discussion with department heads and hopes they can appreciate the past tough year and today's decision are a start to his plan.
