Meeting called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Chairman Greg Barnett with members Rusty Eddy and Tom Heidenwirth present

Jim Lindaman with Butler Soil and Water Conservation Commission provided a copy of their report and newsletter and shared the staffing updates in the past year. Lindeman requested \$5000 for FY22 funding of their program and thanked the board for past funding.

Chris Showalter presented two estimates for glass windows at each counter. Showalter received estimates from Z&Z Glass in Iowa Falls, and Ramker Construction in Waverly. The Z&Z Glass estimate was \$8600 and provided sample pictures taken in the Hardin County Courthouse in Eldora. The Ramker Construction estimate was for \$14112 and pictures were taken in the Bremer County Courthouse in Waverly. Showalter explained the difference in the designs, products used and timeframes.
