Taran Sherburne. The evaluations

without discussion.

ary. Highlights included the Images  
of Christmas with the collaboration  
of the Nursing Home to provide live  
window scenes as well as Holiday  
Open House that lasted for a week  
including the Tiny Tree display and  
welcoming Santa to town.

Police Chief provided report with  
calls totaling 95 for November.

Maintenance: Building Permits:  
1. Sterling Kroeze: 103 W. Walnut;  
putting up a fence. Maintenance  
presented and answered questions  
regarding the placement.

Motion Sherburne, Doty to ap-  
prove building permit for Sterling  
Kroeze as presented by Mainte-  
nance. Ayes: Doty, Reints, Kiel-  
man, Saulsbury, and Sherburne.  
Nays: None. Absent: None.

Heuer discussed resident wanting  
council to look at changing policy  
to enable for leaves to be blown/  
raked into the street for City to  
pick up. Sherburne states we just  
do not have the equipment to take  
care of this and Heuer states that  
we already have trouble keeping  
the leaves from the gutter system.  
Brunner states that this fall they  
moved at least 7 bucket loads of  
leaves from the streets. Consen-  
sus of the council is to leave the  
policy as is.

Another resident concern was  
possibly purchasing piece of equip-  
ment to move snow away from peo-  
ples' driveways. Clerk checked  
on pricing of this piece of equip-  
ment from Ziegler quoted price at  
~\$25,000. Sherburne's concerns  
are that this would slow down the  
street cleaning process and the  
only places that are using this are  
much larger towns, with more snow  
fall and man power. Doty states  
that he also checked with surround-  
ing towns and did not find that any  
of them have this piece of equip-  
ment. Brunner states that he would  
rather have a street sweeper if City  
wants to look at purchasing piece

of equipment.

Clerk provided update regard-  
ing the Butler County Community  
Grant received for computer up-  
dates and improvements in the  
amount of \$1500.00. Council was  
thankful for the award.
