Butler County Soil and Water Conservation Funding Request was made by Jim Lindaman. He stated that he appreciated the assistance from the previous years and was hoping they would keep them in mind this year as well. Barnett mentioned that they will review it and he did not see any issues with continuing to help.

Public Health Director, Jennifer Becker, addressed a line item concerning losses to staff that have yet to be re-hired. In anticipation of hiring, that section of the budget has made room for these positions. Also, new software has to be purchased due to a discontinuance of the current software. Finally, the potential of the Public Health partment relocating to a different/ new building has been added to the future budget. The total budget is expected to be down \$150,000, largely due to the COVID money received, which covered some expenses. Becker also explained that

there were more deaths in Butler County this past year and they required more autopsies, which cost the department.

John Riherd, County Engineer, discussed his FY22 budget in more detail while setting up the FY23 budget. He explained that local construction is a large portion of what is budgeted, and transfers are received from Capital Projects to cover these expenses. The majority of other items are related to salary increases. A \$2 million in property tax asking will be made for secondary roads which is an increase from previous years. Riherd also explained how he keeps track of used funds but utilizing the transfers from Capital Projects. This allows him to report the expenditures better but it creates confusion with his budget seemingly being off by \$2 million, as that portion of his expenditures is recuperated through the Capital Projects funds and budget.

Barnett moved on to the Butler County Libraries funding request. County Auditor, Leslie Groen, pro-

vided information from libraries in surrounding counties. They stated that most libraries have a specific ask for funding, as opposed to the group of Library requests within Butler County. Groen stated that she will seek more information from

libraries and they will discuss it fur-
