ditor Tim Woods and Randy Johnson, New Hartford City Council, were present to discuss the Broadway St. bridge. Dave Scanlan, County Engineer, informed them that they could possibly speed up the process to survey the bridge. The Engineers office is initiating contact with the Iowa Flood Center to see what the latest timeline is for them to complete the survey. They also asked about the floodgate outside of New Hartford. Eddy commented that it was left with the City of New Hartford having the authority to open or close the gate. David Kuehner, County Attorney, mentioned that he had a conversation with Charles Grassley where he stated that the City only has authority to close the gate if flooding was imminent. There continues to be a lot of gray area as to who is responsible to make that determination. Barnett commented that it would be nice to get the Grassleys' in here so that everybody was on the same page. Board discussed updates on the

hazardous pipeline litigation and impacts on the pending ordinance. Misty Day, Planning & Zoning Administrator, and Kuehner provided updates stating that other counties, including Bremer County,

have been sued after like ordinances were passed. Day will move forward with the Planning and Zoning public hearing scheduled for April 20th and the Board will review their recommendation next week to consider next steps. Kuehner recommended the Board to table the ordinance and wait so that we are not named in a lawsuit as well. Barnett commented that surveyors will continue to survey but they are supposed to leave if asked to leave by landowners.

Board reviewed Resolution 1075-2023 for a new money market account. Roxie Nicolaus, Treasurer, stated that Greenbelt approached her with good interest rates and she would like to open a money market account with them.
