MINUTES AND PROCEEDINGS OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BUTLER COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HELD ON JUNE 8, 2021.

With social distancing guidelines being maintained at in-person meetings, an electronic participation option is made available. This complies with Iowa Code section 21.8 that outlines the guidelines to hold an electronic meeting when there are valid concerns that an in-person meeting is "impossible or impractical".

Meeting called to order at 9:00 A.M. by Chairman Greg Barnett with members Rusty Eddy and Tom Heidenwirth present. Moved by Heidenwirth, second by Eddy to approve the agenda. All ayes. Motion carried.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read. Motioned by Barnett, second by Eddy to approve the minutes as read. Ayes: Barnett and Eddy. Heidenwirth abstained from voting as he was absent from the June 1, 2021 meeting. Motion carried.

No public comment received. Ted and Kimberly Junker, New Hartford, were present in-person as they thought the moratorium reviews associated with the wind turbines were going to be discussed today. Barnett explained the board approved to move forward with publishing a resolution for Alternate Energy Production Facilities Permit and that a public hearing will be held regarding that resolution before the board votes on that resolution. County Auditor Leslie Groen stated the public hearing notice with resolution will be published this week with a June 22nd public hearing date. Junker reiterated he was present to represent citizens who oppose wind farms in Butler County and Barnett thanked them for coming.

Rick Fisher, New Hartford, was present in-person to discuss two separate issues. Fisher first provided facts regarding the removal of dirt from a dirt pile near New Hartford. He explained the New Hartford Campers Club, Inc. moved a large amount of dirt out of the county stock pile for approximately 5 hours to the race track near there. Fisher provided some calculations and an estimated of the cost of the dirt and the cost to the county. He explained he was representing others who wanted to know the county's policy or who was authorized to allow citizens to remove dirt. Fisher suggested utilizing a permit application for citizens who would like some dirt. In addition, Fisher wanted to discuss the existing grade of his driveway because it impairs his view and does not allow for all the water to drain properly on the sides of his driveway. Fisher explained he has called the Engineer's office several times over the years and his concerns were not addressed. County Engineer, John Riherd, explained he was aware of this issue and they have looked at in the past but because it was wet at the time it could not be addressed and explained the challenges with drainage in that

area. Riherd explained the stock pile is ditch dirt, not black dirt and is a bi-product of cleaning out waterways. Riherd continued to explain it is their policy to first attempt to put dirt in a field and second attempt is if someone has a truck, they will put dirt in the truck. Fisher feels the coordination and notification between the county and citizens could be improved. Riherd explained generally they do not allow citizens to take dirt from the pile, but felt this particular request was for a non-profit organization benefiting a recreational area that many people enjoy, so he decided to allow it. Additional discussions were held regarding county dirt stock pile approval options, liability and county policy changes. Barnett explained they could take a look at his driveway and get that addressed now that it is dry. Riherd shared some options and also said they would take a look at his situation. In addition, Barnett and Riherd said they would discuss the dirt pile situation, review the current policy and possibly make some updates to the policy for clarification. Barnett thanked Fisher for bringing his concerns forward.

Public Health Director Jennifer Becker explained the possibility of using a portion of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds for a new Public Health building. Becker explained during a recent department head meeting they discussed to form a committee to discuss and plan how to use the \$2.8 million of ARPA funds appropriately and according to. Heidenwirth explained they have looked into a Public Health building in the past and there had been some preliminary planning at that time. County Engineer John Riherd mentioned there were some initial plans but as needs were assessed the building plans were beyond the initial scope and could not be funded. Barnett mentioned there have been discussions to build a new Public Health building next to the EMA building and utilize some of the space already available in the EMA building. Heidenwirth stated he would prefer to have the Public Health building on the courthouse square vs. next to the EMA building. Discussions were held regarding other possible uses of the funding such as possible water/sewer or broadband infrastructure options, the benefits of a committee and which supervisor would be on the committee. The committee created will consist of Public Health Director Jennifer Becker, Emergency Management Coordinator Chris Showalter, Sheriff Jason Johnson, County Engineer John Riherd, County Auditor Leslie Groen, and Supervisor Greg Barnett. Heidenwirth shared that he had discussed a new Public Health building months ago when were first found out about this funding and Becker agreed Heidenwirth has been a big supporter of a new Public Health building for years. Groen will organize the committee meetings and begin getting those scheduled. County Recorder Janice Jacobs commented she feels it is advantageous to keep the Environ-

mental Health Specialist located in the courthouse.

Moved by Barnett, second by Heidenwirth to approve a utility permit for Windstream to install service line to 26525 2nd Street, Kesley. All ayes. Motion carried.

Barnett provided details of an ICAP settlement claim involving an incident from two years ago in which a 10-year-old child climbed a county dirt pile and touched an overhead powerline. In accordance with Iowa Code Chapter 21.5, it was moved by Eddy, second by Barnett to move to closed session for ICAP settlement discussion. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motioned by Barnett, second by Heidenwirth to return to open session. All ayes. Motion carried. Barnett shared that following discussion with County Attorney Dave Kuehner, it has been recommended the county settle this claim with the county being responsible for the \$5000 deductible and ICAP will pay \$37500. Motioned by Eddy, second by Heidenwirth to approve the claim settlement as presented. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motioned by Barnett, second by Heidenwirth to approve claims. All ayes. Motion carried. Butler County claims paid May 1, 2021 through May 31, 2021

MINUTES AND PROCEEDINGS OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BUTLER COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HELD ON JUNE 8, 2021.

With social distancing guidelines being maintained at in-person meetings, an electronic participation option is made available. This complies with Iowa Code section 21.8 that outlines the guidelines to hold an electronic meeting when there are valid concerns that an in-person meeting is "impossible or impractical". Meeting called to order at 9:00 A.M. by Chairman Greg Barnett with members Rusty Eddy and Tom Heidenwirth present. Moved by Heidenwirth, second by Eddy to approve the agenda. All ayes. Motion carried. Minutes of the previous meeting were read. Motioned by Barnett, second by Eddy to approve the minutes as read. Ayes: Barnett and Eddy. Heidenwirth abstained from voting as he was absent from the June 1, 2021 meeting. Motion carried. No public comment received. Ted and Kimberly Junker, New Hartford, were present in-person as they thought the moratorium reviews associated with the wind turbines were going to be discussed today. Barnett explained the board approved to move forward with publishing a resolution for Alternate Energy Production Facilities Permit and that a public hearing will be held regarding that resolution before the board votes on that resolution. County Auditor Leslie Groen stated the public hearing notice with resolution will be published this week with a June 22nd public hearing date. Junker reiterated he was present to represent citizens who oppose wind farms in Butler County and Barnett thanked them for coming. Rick Fisher, New Hartford, was present in-person to discuss two separate issues. Fisher first provided facts regarding the removal of dirt from a dirt pile near New Hartford. He explained the New Hartford Campers Club, Inc. moved a large amount of dirt out of the county stock pile for approximately 5 hours to the race track near there. Fisher provided some calculations and an estimated of the cost of the dirt and the cost to the county. He explained he was representing others who wanted to know the county's policy or who was authorized to allow citizens to remove dirt. Fisher suggested utilizing a permit application for citizens who would like some dirt. In addition, Fisher wanted to discuss the existing grade of his driveway because it impairs his view and does not allow for all of the water to drain properly on the sides of his driveway. Fisher explained he has called the Engineer's office several times over the years and his concerns were not addressed. County Engineer, John Riherd, explained he was aware of this issue and they have looked at in the past but because it was wet at the time it could not be addressed and explained the challenges with drainage in that

area. Riherd explained the stock pile is ditch dirt, not black dirt and is a bi-product of cleaning out waterways. Riherd continued to explain it is their policy to first attempt to put dirt in a field and second attempt is if someone has a truck, they will put dirt in the truck. Fisher feels the coordination and notification between the county and citizens could be improved. Riherd explained generally they do not allow citizens to take dirt from the pile, but felt this particular request was for a non-profit organization benefiting a recreational area that many people enjoy, so he decided to allow it. Additional discussions were held regarding county dirt stock pile approval options, liability and county policy changes. Barnett explained they could take a look at his driveway and get that addressed now that it is dry. Riherd shared some options and also said they would take a look at his situation. In addition, Barnett and Riherd said they would discuss the dirt pile situation, review the current policy and possibly make some updates to the policy for clarification. Barnett thanked Fisher for bringing his concerns forward. Public Health Director Jennifer Becker explained the possibility of using a portion of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds for a new Public Health building. Becker explained during a recent department head meeting they discussed to form a committee to discuss and plan how to use the \$2.8 million of ARPA funds appropriately and according to. Heidenwirth explained they have looked into a Public Health building in the past and there had been some preliminary planning at that time. County Engineer John Riherd mentioned there were some initial plans but as needs were assessed the building plans were beyond the initial scope and could not be funded. Barnett mentioned there have been discussions to build a new Public Health building next to the EMA building and utilize some of the space already available in the EMA building. Heidenwirth stated he would prefer to have the Public Health building on the courthouse square vs. next to the EMA building. Discussions were held regarding other possible uses of the funding such as possible water/sewer or broadband infrastructure options, the benefits of a committee and which supervisor would be on the committee. The committee created will consist of Public Health Director Jennifer Becker, Emergency Management Coordinator Chris Showalter, Sheriff Jason Johnson, County Engineer John Riherd, County Auditor Leslie Groen, and Supervisor Greg Barnett. Heidenwirth shared that he had discussed a new Public Health building months ago when they were first building out about this funding and Becker agreed Heidenwirth has been a big supporter of a new Public Health building for years. Groen will organize the committee meetings and begin getting those scheduled. County Recorder Janice Jacobs commented she feels it is advantageous to keep the Environ-

mental Health Specialist located in the courthouse. Moved by Barnett, second by Heidenwirth to approve a utility permit for Windstream to install service line to 26525 2nd Street, Kesley. All ayes. Motion carried. Barnett provided details of an ICAP settlement claim involving an incident from two years ago in which a 10-year-old child climbed a county dirt pile and touched an overhead powerline. In accordance with Iowa Code Chapter 21.5, it was moved by Eddy, second by Barnett to move to closed session for ICAP settlement discussion. All ayes. Motion carried. Motioned by Barnett, second by Heidenwirth to return to open session. All ayes. Motion carried. Barnett shared that following discussion with County Attorney Dave Kuehner, it has been recommended the county settle this claim with the county being responsible for the \$5000 deductible and ICAP will pay \$37500. Motioned by Eddy, second by Heidenwirth to approve the claim settlement as presented. All ayes. Motion carried. Motioned by Barnett, second by Heidenwirth to approve claims. All ayes. Motion carried.
