No public comment received. Public Health Director, Jennifer

Becker, shared there were 8 cases, 1 recovery, no hospitalizations or deaths and a 2.0% positivity rate, which is up slightly. Becker shared the FDA and CDC both recommended to halt administering the Johnson & Johnson vaccine. Iowa Department of Health also notified to immediately stop vaccinating because there have been 6 rare blood clots out of 6.8 million doses administered but out of caution the are halting to research further. But-ler County Public Health has postposed vaccination clinics for three manufacturers that were scheduled this week to administer approximately 200-250 Johnson & Johnson vaccine but those have been put on hold. Becker shared they still have a boost clinic and prime clinic scheduled this week with the Moderna vaccine. Becker explained last week they received 500 of Johnson & Johnson in addition to their normal weekly allocation of Moderna. Becker also shared they administered approximately 100 Johnson & Johnson vaccinations last week.

County Treasurer, Roxanne Nicolaus, provided the wage step proposal for a new employee working in Driver's License area. Nicolaus explained the wage step is related to training certifications acquired and not a timeline. Motioned by Heidenwirth, second by Eddy to approve the Employee Wage Step Proposal. All ayes. Riherd explained the Urban Renewal Area will need to be amended to include the new soy processing plant to make them eligible for the tax rebates that have been offered. Iowa Department of Health also notified to immediately stop vaccinating because there have been 6 rare blood clots out of 6.8 million doses administered but out of caution the are halting to research further. Butler County Public Health has postposed vaccination clinics for three manufacturers that were scheduled this week to administer approximately 200-250 Johnson & Johnson vaccine but those have been put on hold. Becker shared they still have a boost clinic and prime clinic scheduled this week with the Moderna vaccine. Becker explained last week they received 500 of Johnson & Johnson in addition to their normal weekly allocation of Moderna. Becker also shared they administered approximately 100 Johnson

& Johnson vaccinations last week. County Treasurer, Roxanne Nicolaus, provided the wage step proposal for a new employee working in Driver's License area.
